leapfrogging- American WW2 strategy in the Pacific where heavily defended islands were bypassed to capture nearby islands that were not well defended.

kamikaze- In Japanese it means "divine wind", it was the WW2 Japanese tactic of using bomb-filled planes to crash into Allied ships in suicide attacks.

atomic bomb- Devastating weapons that use the energy released from splitting the nuclei of uranium or plutonium atoms.

Manhattan Project- Top secret American project to develop atomic weapons.
